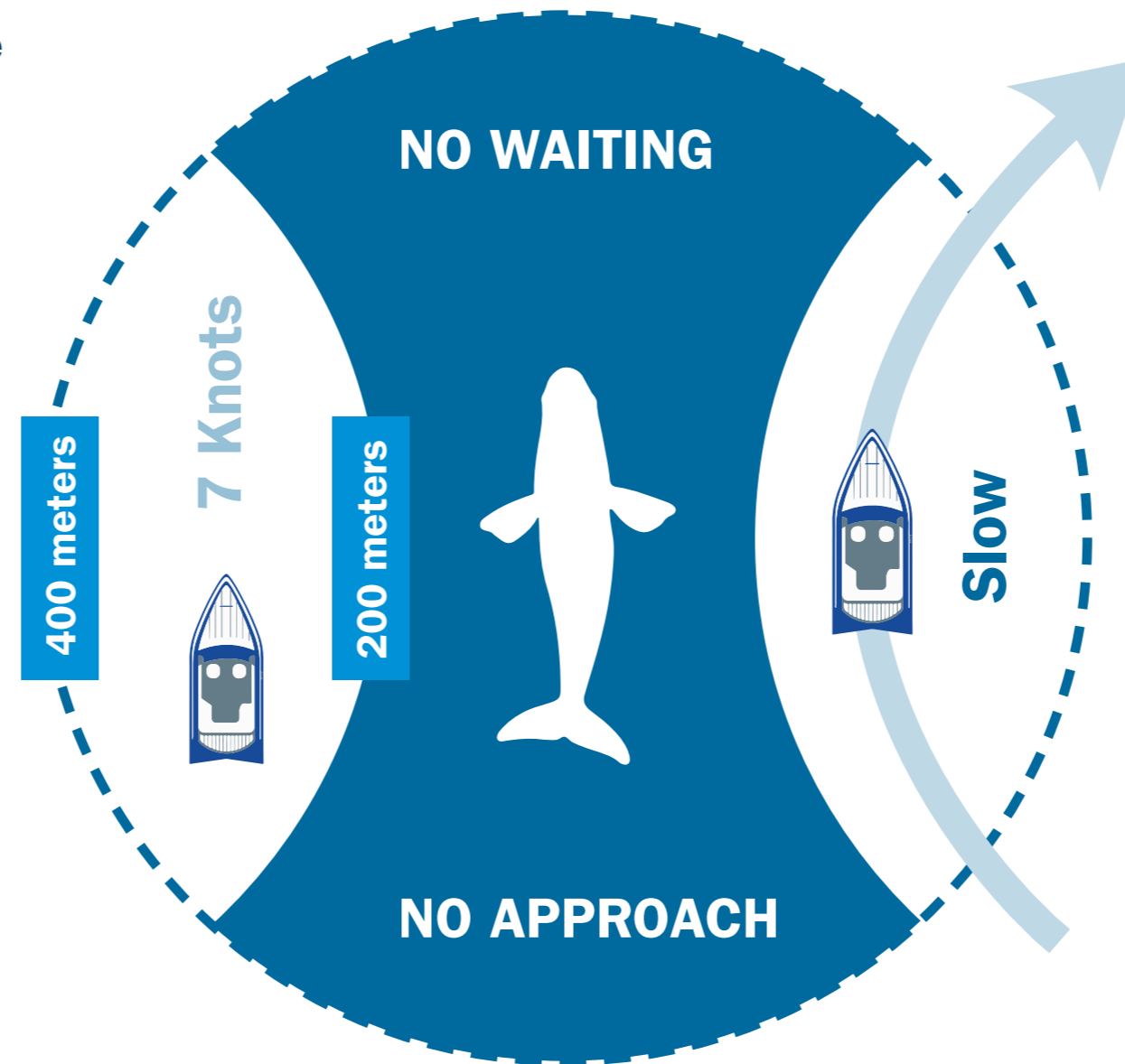


Whale Watching Guidance

When out in a boat, you can minimize the risk of disturbing whales by:

- ✓ Stay at least 200 meters away from whales
- ✓ Reduce your speed to 7 knots when within 400 meters of any whale
- ✓ If a whale surfaces when closer than 100 meters to your vessel, stop immediately
- ✓ Approach whales from the side, and keep clear of their path
- ✓ Even if you're not looking for whales, keep your eyes out for a blow
- ✓ Staying on the inshore side of the whales when they're travelling close to shore
- ✓ Limiting your viewing time to 30 minutes to reduce the impact of many vessels and give consideration to other viewers



DO NOT

- Don't swim with, touch or feed whales
- Don't encircle whales with boats
- Avoid change directions quickly
- Don't park your boat in their path
- Don't approach whales when they're resting (the whale will look like it's not moving and will be floating at the surface)
- Don't place your boat between individual whales
- Don't approach head on or from behind, as this will cut off their movements
